We analyze both open- and closed-access publications

All of our **open-access** content includes articles published on PubMed Central within the last 15 years, including many papers that are subject to the [National Institute of Health \(NIH\) 2008 Open Access Policy](#), ensuring that all publications describing research funded by the NIH are made publicly available within 12 months of publication.

Our **closed-access** content includes articles from our publishing partners, a topic covered in more detail in our [article about how comprehensive our database is](#).

What if I don't have a subscription to those journals?

Some scientific journals are **closed-access**, meaning you or your institution needs to pay for a subscription to access articles from that journal.

BenchSci analyzes content from both open- and closed-access journals, and you can view the reagent that was used in each figure, whether it's from an open- or closed-access journal. However, as part of our publisher agreements, figure legends and/or the figures themselves from closed-access journals are hidden.
